Mosquito Eaters

Mosquitoes are a problem just about everywhere in NYS. If you don't have a problem with them tell me where you live and I'll think about moving. We are told to drain the standing water that accumulates in old tires, empty flower pots and your neglected backyard ponds. Anything that catches water is a breeding place for mosquitoes. The DEC has plans to reintroduce the northern cricket frog (Acris crepitans) a NYS endangered species. These tiny amphibians inhabit natural wetlands, are capable of jumping 6 feet, and eat mosquitoes. The DEC will identify places suitable for the frogs, including locales where they lived previously. Fracking Banned In NYS (at least for now)!

In June of this year, after more than seven years of study, the state Department of Environmental Conservation issued a ban on fracking. DEC Commissioner Joe Martens said that "High-volume hydraulic fracturing poses significant adverse impacts to land, air, water, natural resources and potential significant public health impacts that cannot be adequately mitigated.
