## FAQs

- Landscape Design Schools (LDS) is a series of four courses presented by distinguished lecturers on landscape design, methods, history, theory and analysis. LDS is open to the public. The courses do not confer professional status.
- This course is certified by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) that mandates the Course requirements. Each course consists of lectures, readings from the text, the course handouts and other readings. Tours of designed landscapes are not included in this curriculum except for Highland Park, Rochester, NY, in Course 4.
- LDS benefits anyone who wants to enhance their knowledge of landscape design—personally, for civic projects or as an introduction to a future career. It is a prerequisite for NGC members who wish to become a Consultant and join a prestigious Landscape Design Council (LDC).
- \*After successfully completing two courses, a member obtains Provisional Consultant status. Join your District Landscape Design Consultants Council.

- \*After successfully completing all four courses their status changes to Landscape Design Consultant status. LDS also serve as credit for Consultants to refresh their credentials or attain Master Consultant status. See NGC LDS website for specifics.
- A student may start with any course. To receive credit for Consultant status, four courses must be completed by the end of the seventh calendar year. You may take all courses within a year, if desired.

## FAQs cont'd

- Attendance at all lectures is required to receive credit. Unfortunately, we are unable to excuse absences.
- While optional, all students are encouraged to take the exam. If, prior to attending Course 4, you read the Chapters in **Stewards of the Land**, the article in **The National Gardener**, the handouts provided, and listen to the lectures, you should be able to pass the exams.
- The exam is on the assigned readings, lectures, and course information. The lectures supplement the readings and do not teach the text. The Course Information is distributed by email prior to the course. It is important to read the required readings prior to attending class and prior to taking the exam. The exam is open book. The exam given at the end of each day covers material from only that day's lectures and readings.
- \*\*Those taking this course as a student must complete [Form 6-2021](#), and as a Refreshing Consultant [Form 7- 2021](#). Submit the form when registering for Course 4.** Notify your State LDS Chairman you are taking the course, especially if you are out of state.

• **NOTE:** There are no longer automatic consultant extensions for **ANY** Gardening, Environmental, or Landscape Design Consultants. To remain in good standing, Consultants must continue their education by attending a Refresher or a Landscape Design School course by the end of five calendar years after becoming a Consultant or the last Refreshing. *No exam is required.* After the fourth Refresher, the Consultant becomes a Master Consultant. Refresher credit can be earned only once within a calendar year. If you need an extension, you need to apply for it with your state LDS Chairman.
